In Search of Developmental Coordination Disorder: A quest for an under recognized disorder

A free public seminar for parents, families, allied health professionals, and general practitioners.

Dr. Dewey is Professor of Pediatrics and Community Health Sciences at the University of Calgary and Director of the Behavioural Research Unit, Department of Paediatrics. She is internationally recognized for her research into the etiology, identification and outcomes of neurodevelopmental disorders. She has been investigating Developmental Coordination Disorder for over 25 years. Her research has added to our understanding of the genetic basis of this disorder, its neural underpinnings and the cognitive and psychosocial outcomes of children with DCD. Dr. Dewey has published over 100 peer-reviewed papers and is actively involved in broader knowledge translation initiatives to increase awareness among professionals and community members of neurodevelopmental disorders, particularly DCD. She will provide an overview of her research on genetic and neural mechanisms of DCD and discuss the implications of this research to assessment and intervention.
